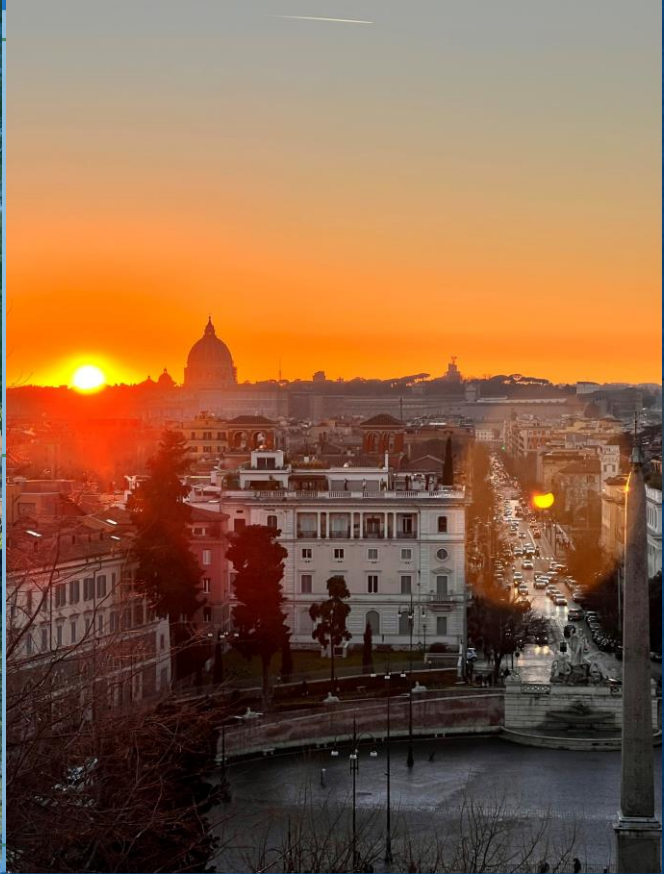
*M: The items more or less overlap and I had no problem with the arrangement of the LA.*

*M: 3 metro lines, lots of buses and trams. which, unfortunately, drive as they please :D It's good to live near the University or on the subway line B.*



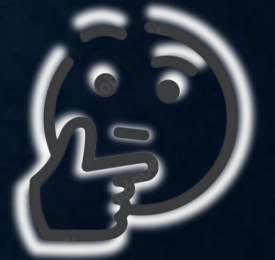
**E+: Food (was there a canteen for students? Discounts on meals?):**
