***P:** There are buses, you can have a card, but I didn't use it, but I used city bikes (3.00 EUR for an annual subscription).*



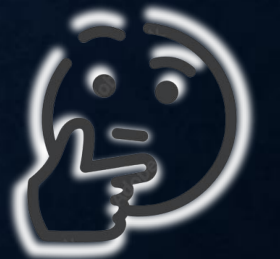
### **E+: Food (was there a canteen for students? Discounts on meals?):**
