<p>Causes, symptoms, principles of diagnosis and treatment in relation to the most common internal diseases in adults and their complications, including in particular diseases of the kidneys and urinary system; acute kidney injury and chronic kidney disease - principles of diagnosis, monitoring and conservative and renal replacement therapy; multimorbidity resulting from the aging process, the specificity of diagnosis and treatment of the elderly; principles of interdisciplinary care; symptoms, principles of diagnosis and treatment in the most common hereditary diseases of the urinary system; the basics of early detection of urinary tract cancers and the principles of screening; pain management; diagnosis and treatment of life-threatening conditions; indications for the implementation of monitored therapy, planning specialist consultations; qualification for outpatient and hospital treatment; individualization of applicable therapeutic guidelines; transfusion medicine in clinical practice; nutritional treatment; methods of rehabilitation in cases of selected internal diseases, including diseases of the urinary system; keeping medical records; rules of conduct in accordance with the latest guidelines based on EBM; individualization of applicable therapeutic guidelines; polypharmacy; side effects and drug interactions; principles of health promotion and pro-health behaviors; critical analysis of medical literature; the ethical dimension of medical decisions; respecting the rights of the patient; teamwork.</p>
