Symptoms, ophthalmological examination, methods of diagnosis, differentiation and therapy (conservative local and general and surgical treatment) of eye diseases; ophthalmic complications of systemic drugs; recognizing ophthalmological conditions requiring immediate specialist assistance, providing initial assistance in case of physical and chemical eye injuries; diagnosis and management in diseases of the retina; glaucoma; issues of surgical transplantology, indications for corneal transplantation; eye diseases in children; the effect of systemic drugs on the organ of vision; using databases and searching for necessary information using available tools; critical analysis of the literature.
