Anatomy and physiology of head and neck structures: nose, paranasal sinuses, oral cavity, pharynx, esophagus, larynx, trachea, outer, middle and inner ear; selected issues in the field of laryngology, phoniatrics and audiology, including: causes, symptoms, clinical course, methods of treatment, complications and prognosis in diseases of the ear, nose, paranasal sinuses, oral cavity, pharynx and larynx in adults, facial nerve diseases and selected neck structures, principles of diagnostic procedures and therapeutic procedures in mechanical injuries of the ear, nose, larynx and esophagus, principles of emergency management in otorhinolaryngology, in particular laryngeal dyspnea, principles of diagnostic and therapeutic procedures in hearing, voice and speech disorders, diagnostic and therapeutic procedures in head and neck cancers ; emergencies in otolaryngology; Work in team; compliance with ethical standards and patient rights.
